Aim of the project

EACH is a global organisation, encouraging collaboration and exchange of ideas, with the aim of improving communication in healthcare.

As the national representatives for the UK membership, we wished to facilitate collaboration at a more 'local' level, by putting UK members in contact with each other and forming a UK Network.

Methods

All UK members of EACH were invited to participate. Members were asked to provide a short paragraph about their areas of interest, contact details and a photo. Results

Members come from all four countries of the UK, including researchers, educators and practitioners from a variety of professional backgrounds. Members often have multiple roles, enhancing the breadth of expertise available to share within the Network.
