# **EU Copyright Consultation**

- EU held public Consultation on Copyright reform (ended 5 March 2014)
- ☐ See
  - http://ec.europa.eu/internal \_market/consultations/2013 /copyrightrules/index\_en.htm
- □ 9,500 replies to the consultation document and a total of more than 11,000 messages





# Key Messages from research universities

- ☐ EU Copyright and Database Directives need reform
- ☐ Ensure that Exceptions for libraries and researchers are a right that cannot be overridden by contract
- Accommodate the university knowledge transfer agenda by removing the requirement on these institutions to ensure that all exception based research copying is "non-commercial"



#### And more...

- ☐ Support international collaboration by harmonising copyright exceptions and limitations and ensuring that they work across borders
- ☐ Allow libraries to digitise content that is unavailable commercially

# And yet more...

- □ Increase the availability of digital content by reducing the term of copyright
- ☐ Introduce flexibility in the copyright regime to ensure that each and every noncompeting and non-rivalrous use of an incopyright work does not require many years of legislative revision

# WIPO meeting (May 2014) in Geneva

- ☐ Discussions by the World
  Intellectual Property
  Organisation (WIPO) Standing
  Committee on Copyright &
  Related Rights (SCCR) broke
  down in the early hours of
  Saturday morning May 3, 2014
- □ European Union (EU)
  attempted to block future
  discussion of copyright laws to
  aid libraries and archives fulfil
  their missions in the digital
  environment

# EU kills copyright deal



□ "The position taken by the EU delegation in Geneva contrasts strongly with current discussions at European level, where it has been recognised that copyright exceptions for libraries are essential, and must be harmonised in order to facilitate international research and innovation in the age of Science 2.0. The conservative position taken at SCCR 27 in Geneva this week is therefore deeply disappointing. It does not support research and education and hampers European researchers in their use of new tools and services"



# LIBER / LERU react to European Publishers Council's rejection of TDM Exception

- In our [EPC]'s view this is "a snare and a delusion" perpetrated by those intent on gaining free access to the widest possible body of copyright works in the name of research, going way beyond scientific journals, to works of all published authors, as well as Europe's news media and entertainment." (p. 48)


We do not recognise the request for an Exception in European copyright frameworks to accommodate Text and Data Mining as 'a snare and a delusion'

- □ 17 July Commission says it will not be issuing a Copyright White Paper in response to Copyright Consultation
- □ Neelie Kroes marshalled arguments against Michel Barnier's proposed paper
  - ☐ 'Reforming copyright is 'a major, essential part' of the EU's commitment to creating a single digital market'



# Text and Data Mining (TDM) – what is it?

- ☐ TDM derives information from machine-read material
- ☐ It works by copying large quantities of material, extracting the data, and recombining it to identify patterns
- ☐ Essential aspect of Science 2.0 or Open Science

#### **TDM**

- □ Less TDM activity is undertaken in Europe than other parts of the globe, partly because of European copyright frameworks
- ☐ Publishers offering licences for TDM which are limiting
- EU TDM Expert Group has argued for an Exception for TDM in EU copyright laws

□ Or a broader change in the form of an open norm or an interpretive instrument



#### Publishers' TDM licences - Elsevier

- ☐ 18 research organisations have asked Elsevier to withdraw its TDM licence
- ☐ Presenting researchers with no other option but to register their details and agree to a click-through licence, the terms of which can change at any time, in order to gain access to content for the purpose of TDM is unacceptable. It places undue liability on the researcher and undermines the role of the institution as an intermediary tasked with protecting its researchers' privacy, as well as its ability to protect its intellectual capital

#### Publishers' TDM licences - Elsevier

- ☐ The licence for access to content should not limit the choice of text and data mining tools available to researchers, neither those developed by the researcher themselves or provided by a third party
- □ Rather than putting technical measures in place to prevent crawling by robots, publishers should encourage the adoption of protocols for responsible crawling of content, which would ensure that the load placed on publishers' servers by TDM activities remains negligible

- ☐ Aim for Exception for TDM in next 12 months


