Between them, facing the seated figure a small girl with a bird in her right hand. In the background standing female figure facing right (The name kallippe might correspond either to the seated or the standing figure). This left group is facing another one on the right consisting of a female figure seated on a 'thronos' and facing left (Neoptoleme) and two standing bearded men (Apollodoros and Apollophanes) facing also left. Apollodoros, in the background, touches with his right hand the back of Mnesiptolemos. The relief is carved in such a way that the middle of the left group is diametrically opposite the handle of the lekythos.

## II2a Themes
